

Contemplations from Chapter 5 in *I Stand on Holy Ground*

- *I am the son of God, the manifestation of God's own being. God is revealing Himself on earth as my being, manifesting as my mind, my life, my soul, and my spirit, and even as the law unto my being.*
- *No law can operate upon me. All law must operate out from and through me. Only the law of God can operate in, on, and through my consciousness, and nothing from without can enter that defiles or makes a lie.*
- *The law of God manifests in my soul and spirit. The law of God moves in my inward parts. The law of God manifests in my mind and body. The law of God establishes me, maintains and sustains me free from external influences.*
- *Since I and the Father are one, the qualities and the quantities of the Father are mine. I am the fulfillment of all that God is, and nothing from without can enter my consciousness that defileth or maketh a lie because I stand here in the realization of God as my being.*
- *I in the midst of me is mighty. I is the way, the truth, and the life. All this error that appears as limitation, finiteness, negativity, this is carnal mind, nothingness, the "arm of flesh." This is a universal belief in two powers. But I is the only power. And that I in the midst of me embodies all the God-power there is. I cannot use It: It can use me. If I am still, I in the midst of me will live my life.*
